- O Sun block cream, spray or lotion to apply for outside play. (Please fill out a medication form for each item. You can get this form by asking the teacher, filling it in the Intake under 2 form, or in the office.)
- O Photos of family members (of child, siblings, parents, grandparents, and even pets)

Baby Bottles and Bisphenol A (BPA)

Many food and liquid containers, including baby bottles, are made of polycarbonate, or have a lining that contains the chemical bisphenol A (BPA). BPA is used to harden plastics, keep bacteria from contaminating foods, and prevent cans from rusting.

There are concerns, though, over the possible harmful effects BPA may have on humans, particularly on infants and children. Animal studies have shown effects on the endocrine functions in animals related to BPA exposure. Additional studies will determine what level of BPA exposure might cause similar effects in humans. As research continues, concerned parents can take the following precautionary measures to reduce babies' exposure to BPA:



- Avoid clear plastic baby bottles or containers with the recycling number 7 and the letters "PC" imprinted on them. Many contain BPA.
- Consider using certified or identified BPA-free plastic bottles.
- Use bottles made of opaque plastic. These bottles (made of polyethylene or polypropylene) do not contain BPA. You can also look for the recycle symbols with the number 2 or 5 in them.
- Glass bottles can be an alternative, but be aware of the risk of injury to you or your baby if the bottle is dropped or broken.
- Because heat may cause the release of BPA from plastic, consider the following:
 - Do not boil polycarbonate bottles
 - Do not heat polycarbonate bottles in the microwave
 - Do not wash polycarbonate bottles in the dishwasher

Breastfeeding (/English/ages-stages/baby/breastfeeding/Pages/default.aspx) Breastfeeding is another way to reduce potential BPA exposure. The American Academy of Pediatrics recommends breastfeeding as the sole source of nutrition for your baby for about 6 months. When you add solid foods to your baby's diet, continue breastfeeding until at least 12 months.

If you are considering switching from canned liquid to powdered formula, note that the mixing procedures may differ, so pay special attention when preparing formula from powder.

If your baby is on specialized formula to address a medical condition, you should not switch to another formula, as the known risks would outweigh any potential risks posed by BPA.

Risks associated with giving infants inappropriate (home-made condensed milk) formulas or alternative (soy or goat) milk are far greater than the potential effects of BPA.

All there is to know about the BPA-free range from NUK

The abbreviation BPA stands for Bisphenol A. BPA is a substance in the synthetic material, polycarbonate (PC), which is found in many products we use daily, e.g. plastic bags and food packaging, but also mobile phones and CDs as well as sunglasses, adhesives and nail polish.

Why did BPA come under criticism?

While the use of BPA in the production of the synthetic material PC was widely unnoticed up to the turn of the millennium, a discussion among medical practitioners and scientists began then about the effects of BPA on living organisms. The available studies were not consistant and therefore, different countries and different institutes were very contradictory in their assessments. An open debate picked up on these critical judgements and turned BPA into a subject much discussed in the media. As market leader with many awards for it quality products, NUK has many years of experience with baby bottles made from BPA-free materials such as glass or polypropylene (PP), for example. By completely renouncing BPA, NUK gave some piece of mind back to parents already at an early stage. The ban on manufacturing and selling baby bottles containing BPA in the EU came into force on 1st June, 2011. NUK had already dispensed with polycarbonate bottles that contained BPA long before the demand of the EU and therefore, years before the final banning, could brand its baby products as "BPA-free".

What is the authorities' assessment of the risks from BPA?

The product range for alternatives without BPA is wide. Precisely which materials they are, we explain for you here:

Glass

One of the oldest materials known to man is also used by NUK in the production of baby bottles. Glass is particularly hygienic and heat- resistant. In this process, NUK uses only borosilicate glass, which, with its cross-linked surface structure, wears well and withstands variations in temperature.

PP (Polypropylene)

Polypropylene is a translucent, synthetic material, which is used by NUK for the manufacture of BPA-free baby bottles. Its smooth surface ensures that it is pleasant to touch. It is notably shatterproof and is even suitable for freezing.

PA (Polyamides)

Polyamide are synthetic materials with a high level of transparency, which it retains by being chemical-resistant – discolouring and clouding are a thing of the past. Polyamide is BPA-free, but not suitable for the microwave however.

Learning Through Daily Care Routines-

Our daily care routines meet children's needs and also provide opportunities for adult interaction, relationship building, and promote learning and development. Each child has an individual care plan created with input from the parents to provide consistent care.

Hello's and Goodbye's- Your child's drop-off and pick-up times

At this time children learn to separate and reunite with their families, a lifelong process. This experience provides valuable learning opportunities. Your baby learns to trust as you go and come consistently. Your Infant learns to be a separate person with deep attachments to others.

Diapering and Toileting-

This is a time that happens about every two hours, if your child is awake, they will have a diaper change. 

Hello New Family,

I'm excited to inform you that United Child Care Center uses Procare as our communication tool. Procare will help simplify how we communicate with you and keep you in the know of what your child is doing while in our care. Here is what Procare provides for us:

Procare is accessible from your computer, phone or tablet via their app or website. You will receive an email at the end of your child's day which will include; feedings/meals, diapering/potty, photos/videos, learning activities, naps, moods, medications given, incidents, notes on items needed and more. Procare will be our main form of communication with families so it is important to read your emails. If UCCC were to have an emergency or have to close the center due to inclement weather we will send out a message through Procare. We will also send our monthly newsletters and documents that need to be completed by you.

When you are invited to Procare, you get to choose whether or not you want to create an account. If you are reluctant for any reason, no big deal. You will still receive emails about your child/ren. Once you create an account you are able to edit your profile setting. You can decided what push and email notifications you would like to receive. Our recommendation is to always enable push notifications for meds & incidents, calendar events, and staff messages as they are important to receive immediately.

When you create an account, here is what you will get...

- 1. A secure and private network
- 2. **Staff Messaging-** When you send a message it will be sent to your child's primary teachers and also admin for quicker response.
- 3. Information about only your child
- 4. Calendar- To see events or fieldtrips coming up
- 5. **Documents-** You will be able to look over, sign, date and return all documents.
- 6. Make a payment- Currently we do not have this feature but it will be coming soon.

By using this app within our classroom & center, we will be able to eliminate paper daily sheets, paper newsletters, ouch reports, and paper documents. We want to make family communication our goal, and as seamless as possible. Procare is a secure way to share updates with our families, without the burden of a social network.
